





International Experiences

"I studied abroad in **Canada** for three weeks with Professor McMaster, her husband, and ten other SUNY Cobleskill students. The course was a 300 level Ethics class which took place in many different places because we were traveling around in the school van. We started our trip by leaving from campus and getting to Niagara on the Canadian side within the first night. From the first day we roamed around lots of big cities and other small places but all quite different from one another, for example Montreal and Quebec are both big cities, but Quebec was different because their main language is French. This trip changed me in so many ways that I can't even begin to say, but what I can say for those that haven't thought about doing something like this is, I see people differently, I feel that I know an entire culture and all I want to do is learn more. Why do they do some things just like we do, or why don't they? What are other cultures like? If I go somewhere else in the world will people be even more different then Canadians? "Being able to visit my family after 8 years and get to know my culture was an amazing experience. Cuisine is very popular among the Polish people and saying no to the freshly baked goods is impossible. Apart from all the food, I did go to many historical places in **Poland**. Among them were the Old Town, Tomb of the Unknown Solider, Royal Castle, National Museum of Warsaw and the Palace of Culture and Science. The Old Town is the most popular attraction in Warsaw.
